In a medical emergency

For chest pain, shortness of breath, severe bleeding or trauma or any other life threatening situation, call 911.

Stay on the line with the emergency medical dispatcher, who will direct you until the ambulance arrives and will gather information for both the ambulance crew and emergency room staff.

Do not drive to the ambulance service (they may on call) or to St. Andrews Urgent Care Center or anywhere else.

Average ambulance response time on the Boothbay peninsula is under nine minutes and that will not change.

Do not drive if you are compromised; do not drive with your compromised loved one. Wait for the ambulance.
