Damariscove, one of Maine's earliest settlement sites, is owned and managed by the BRLT. The Abenakis and, later, European fishermen settled and fished there from 1622 to the late 20th century. Damariscove once was a bustling fishing center, one of the population centers in the Maine frontier, with at least 30 vessels & many residents. Later, it was a family-owned farming & fishing community. By the early 1900s the island was a year-round & seasonal fishermen, farmers, coast guardsmen, summer cottagers comunity & a school with 18 students. 
